As dairy producers we know that the quality of the feed produced and stored on our farm is the basis of a successful operation. After moving to our present location, we decided to again build Harvestore silos, and contacted an associate of the people who serviced our silos in Eastern Ontario. Unfortunately, dealing with this “after-market” builder and the resulting storage for forage and high moisture corn that was delivered to our farm, has resulted in some serious consequences and financial setbacks for our herd.

Upon seeking out the advice of the authorized dealer for Engineered Storage Products in Hunenberg Switzerland, the owner Werner Schuler directed us to contact Ontario Harvestore Systems at Innerkip, Ontario.

We have recently purchased a new 20x90 haylage silo from Ontario Harvestore and are currently having their technicians attempting to upgrade the breather systems of the two existing (after-market) silos and leakage in the foundations.

We would urge anyone that may be planning to build Harvestore storage that there are other very important calculations, besides the price, that must be considered.
